S1404: EVIDENCE; ADMISSIBILITY; CERTIFICATE OF ANALYSIS

In any criminal trial or hearing, a certificate of analysis is admissible as evidence if the person who performed the analysis attests to it, and either the certificate is filed with the clerk of the court at least seven days before the trial or hearing, or the analysis was performed by a specified government entity, a copy is provided to the defendant and the defendant has not objected.

Assault is classified as aggravated assault if the defendant knows that the victim is a county park ranger. Increases the felony classifications for various types of aggravated assault if committed on a public defender.

S1433: CITIES; TOWNS; POLICE FUNCTIONS; REVOCATION

Municipalities do not have authority to establish, regulate, appoint or remove the municipal police and to prescribe their powers and duties if 50 percent or more of the municipality's police officers have had their peace officer certifications revoked by the AZ Peace Officer Standards and Training Board. If AZPOST determines that 50 percent or more of a municipality's police officers certifications have been revoked, the county board of supervisors must vote to affirm the determination and direct the county sheriff to immediately assume the law enforcement functions within the municipality. The municipality must reimburse the county sheriff for reasonable costs for providing such law enforcement functions. The municipality may request reinstatement of control after five years. Emergency clause.

S1438: DRUG LAB REMEDIATION; INVESTIGATORS

Establishes a Criminal Investigations Unit in the Board of Technical Registration as a law enforcement agency, and transfers responsibility for regulation of drug lab site remediation firms from the Registrar of Contractors to the Board. Establishes an additional assessment of \$10 for all drug offenses, to be deposited in the Technical Registration Fund. Municipalities and counties may apply to the Fund for remediation monies for property where a drug lab is discovered. Owners of property where a clandestine drug lab is discovered are prohibited from knowingly allowing the posted notice of removal to be disturbed. Violations are subject to a civil penalty of up to \$2,000 for a first offense and criminal prosecution for a class 5 felony for a second or subsequent offense. It is a class 4 felony for owners of property where a drug lab is discovered to knowingly allow a child or vulnerable adult to enter or occupy the property, and a class 5 felony to sell any items from the contaminated portion of the property or lease or rent the property before remediation is complete.

Various changes to financial disclosure filing requirements for elected officials, including modifying definitions of businesses, changing who is included in an elected official's household, increasing the amount of compensation an official may receive before being required to report to \$5,000 from \$1,000, and requiring the Secretary of State to revise financial disclosure forms and handbooks.

H2729: STATE REGULATION OF FIREARMS

The state and state agencies are added to the list of government bodies that are prohibited from enacting certain rules relating to firearms or requiring licensing or registration of firearms or ammunition. Entering a public establishment or attending a public event and carrying a deadly weapon after being requested to remove the weapon is eliminated from the list of actions constituting misconduct involving weapons.

Members of the Arizona State Guard cannot be arrested while on active duty, while engaged in drill or while on the way to or from such duties. Guard members are entitled to the same immunity protection as law enforcement for acts within the scope of duty, and are not liable for jury duty while on active duty with the Guard. The Guard is considered a seizing agency when cooperating with state or local law enforcement agencies.

Political subdivisions are no longer authorized to adopt ordinances or rules restricting the discharge of a firearm within 1/4 mile of an occupied structure.

Establishes a 14-member Joint Legislative Committee on Neutralization of Federal Laws to recommend and propose legislation to neutralize in its entirety a specific federal law or regulation. On the Committee's recommendation, the issue in question is of no effect in Arizona, and the Legislature must vote on whether to nullify the action within 60 days. Contains a purpose and legislative declarations section.

H2696: VULNERABLE ADULTS; FINANCIAL EXPLOITATION

For the purposes of adult protective services, a written expression witnessed by at least two

individuals who do not benefit from the withdrawal of services creates a rebuttable presumption that the person was competent to understand the expression. Transfers of assets for the primary purpose of obtaining eligibility for AHCCCS, supplemental security income, medicaid, medicare or veteran's administration programs and that are between a vulnerable adult and their spouse, disabled child or a trust for the spouse or disabled child cannot be construed as financial exploitation.

H2704: DISCLOSURES; LOBBYIST; GIFTS; PUBLIC OFFICERS

Lobbyists are prohibited from making an expenditure for a gift for a state officer or employee, and state officers and employees are prohibited from accepting a gift from a lobbyist. The exemptions for certain types of entertainment are deleted. Modifies expenditure reporting requirements for lobbyists, and expands the definition of "lobbying" to include attempting to influence legislation by communicating with the Governor or his/her staff. For the purpose of financial disclosures for public officers and candidates, the definition of "gift" is modified. Additionally, public officer financial disclosure statements must be filed monthly, instead of annually, and the maximum amounts of compensation exempted from disclosure are reduced. Penalties for knowingly filing false or incomplete financial disclosures are increased. Financial disclosure statements must be filed electronically, and the Secretary of State is required to provide computer programs to accommodate electronic filings.

Municipal and county ordinances and homeowner's association policies that regulate or prohibit a dog from running at large do not apply if the dog's owner provides proof of canine liability insurance of at least \$100,000 for injury to any person or damage to any property caused by the dog.

Intentionally fleeing from a person who is reasonably known to be a peace officer acting under official authority and who is attempting to lawfully arrest or detain the person is evading arrest or detention, a class 1 misdemeanor. Fleeing arrest or detention for a felony offense that involves the death of another person is a class 2 felony, and that involves the serious bodily

injury of another person is a class 3 felony.

S1474: WEAPONS; UNIVERSITY; COLLEGE GROUNDS

Public universities and community colleges may restrict or prohibit the carrying or transporting of a weapon within any building on campus if a sign meeting certain specifications is conspicuously posted at each public entrance to the building and if the college or university provides temporary and secure storage for the weapon. Except for this policy, public universities and community colleges are prohibited from adopting or enforcing any policy or rule that restricts or prohibits the carrying or transporting of a concealed weapon by a person with a valid concealed weapons permit.

For the purposes of financial disclosure statements by legislators and lobbyist expenditure reports, "gift" includes any item that is more than \$10 in value. Lobbyists are required to report individual expenditures for public officers on a daily basis and aggregate expenditures on a monthly basis, instead of on a quarterly basis. Legislators are required to report daily all expenditures received by or benefitting that legislator from any lobbyist. The Secretary of State is required to provide a system for internet-based filing of lobbyist expenditure reports and public officer recipient reports and internet posting of reports in a searchable format. Establishes civil penalties for violations of reporting requirements. Also establishes a 15-member Lobbying and Financial Disclosure Study Committee and requires the Committee to submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature by December 31, 2013. The Committee self-repeals July 1, 2014. All changes except the Committee are effective January 1, 2013.
