## DRUG TOXICOLOGY SCREENING TESTS

Below is a list of the routine preliminary drug screen panels using Enzyme Linked Immunosorbent assay (ELISA) that are used by the AZ DPS toxicology labs. If a drug appears within a parenthesis ( ), DPS needs to know if it is suspected, otherwise it may be missed.

**DRE's** – Please list your calls on the Scientific Examination request forms. DRE calls of CNS Depressants, Narcotic Analgesics, and Dissociative Anesthetics will always go on for additional testing even if the pre-screen panel is negative.

Whenever in doubt please list all drugs found/suspected/admitted. This will ensure DPS meets all your testing needs.

Additional types of cases: If the case involves a child, officer (e.g., officer involved shooting), sexual assault, or death, the case will receive secondary screening in addition to the ELISA preliminary screen. For a list of potential drugs covered in the secondary screen see the confirmatory data sheet.
